This square two story wood frame large commercial building has a clipped hip roof, small enclosed eaves and a decorative trim on the edge of the clipped roof. Other features include beveled edge wood siding with corner boards and eaves trim boards, wood surround and sill for boarded up windows, wood paneled door with glass gone, and carved wood scroll design. There is a cement foundation. Modern materials include asphalt roofing, and a large casement hung rough timber doorway cut into the south side of the building.

An interesting architectural feature is the two story clipped hip roof design of the building. The only example of this in the study area. This is a contributing structure.

Elizabeth Liddell lived in Roundup 1912-1918. She owned this property from 1911 to 1925.
