Building has clapboard siding with end boards. Windows are wood-frame, double hung 1/1 with wood surround trim. Open front porch has hipped roof, lathed support posts and railing. Rear porch has A shaped roof with wood shingle and corrugated plastic siding about 3/4 of the way to roof line.

This is a contributing structure.

Several sheds are located at rear of property, all have shed roofs. 1 has horizontal board siding with elbow stove pipe extending from North end. 2 & 3 haw composition siding. 4 has simulated ashlar composition siding.
