A one-story T-shaped wood-frame residence with intersecting gables, horizontal beveled siding, enclosed front porch and concrete foundation. Residence has large shed roof addition in the rear added in 1965. Roof has Tshaped corbeled chimney, wood shingles, eaves with molding and rafters. Siding is horizontal-beveled and has end boards. Windows are wood-frame, with wood-surround trim, and double hung 1/1. Windows to the side of the building are sliding, with wood frames, some with alluminum casings. Exterior cinder chimney is located on north side of boilding. Front porch has several in line double hung windows on open of wood siding.

Small roofed shed with horizontal beveled siding, fixed windows with wood surround trim and composition sheet foof is located at rear of property. This is a neutral structure.
