This 12 story wood frame residence has a gable roof with a large shed roof dorner facing the street and rear additions with shed and gable roofs. Other features include: Exposed rafters; 1/1 double hung and multilight double hung windows and an enclosed full front porch recessed under the eaves. There is a cerent foundation. Modern raterials include: asphalt roof shingles; aluminum siding; 3 panel aluminum frame windows in the enclosed porch; 1/1 slide aluminum gable windows; and louvered decorative shutters. To the rear is a vertical wood panel double garage with gable roof, cement foundation and rising 3 light wood panel garage door.

The architectural feature that gives this house character is the street facing front dormer.

This is a contributing structure.

Verne Dusenberry was a lawyer, originally partners with William Jameson (City Clerk, U.S. Commissioner) on Main Street (1912-1915), then later partners with Thomas Matthews (city attorney), 1918. He owned this property from 1911 to 1925.
