

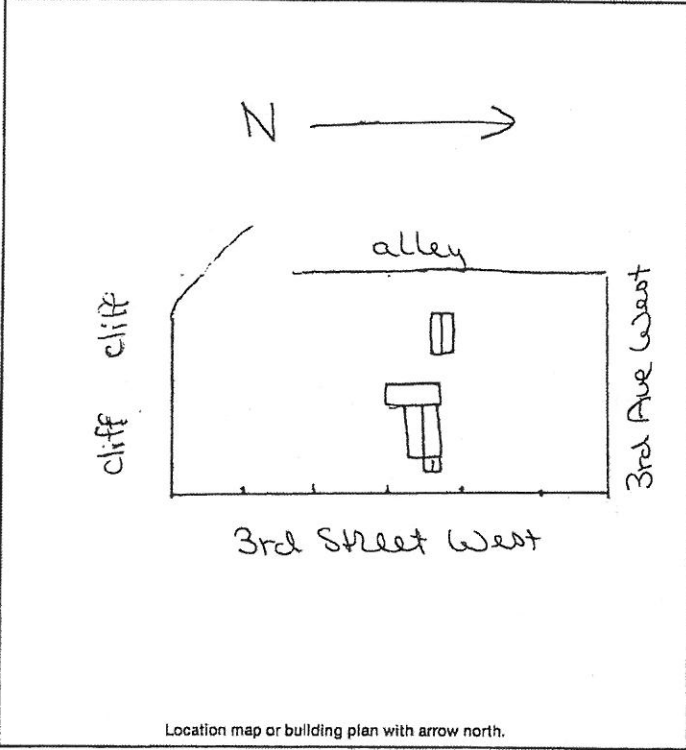

PHYSICAL DESCRIPTION: Describe present appearance of structure/site, then contrast and compare that with it's original appearance, noting additions, alterations, and changes in materials. Discuss significant architectural features.

This one-story wood frame rectangular residence has a gable roof, an enclosed gable roof one-half front porch, and an open covered deck to the rear. Other features include interior brick chimney, extended eaves with purlins and exposed rafters, windows in wood surround, 1/1 row windows in the enclosed porch, and a cement foundation. Modern materials include masonite siding and asphalt roof shingles.

To the back is a rectangular gable roof garage with exposed rafters, asphalt roof shingles, beveled edge siding with corner boards on a tall (3½ foot) bare cement foundation.

Architecturally significant is the purlins, and gable end decoration.
 This is a contributing structure.

This house is located in an upper middle class residential area. This house has some loss of integrity of materials due to the addition of masonite siding and asphalt shingles, but retains integrity of design (gable roof with enclosed entry) and craftsmanship (gable end decoration, purlins).
