


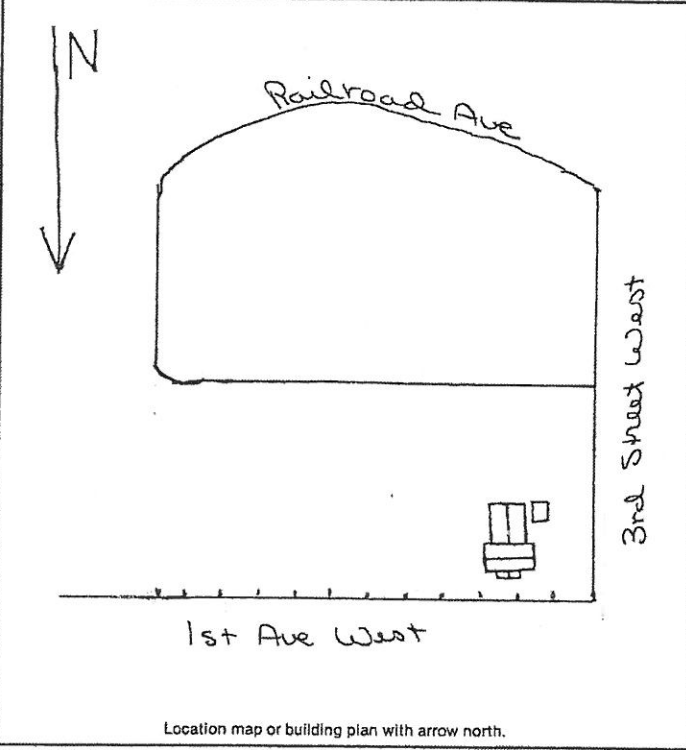

PHYSICAL DESCRIPTION: Describe present appearance of structure/site, then contrast and compare that with it's original appearance, noting additions, alterations, and changes in materials. Discuss significant architectural features.

A one-story, rectangular-shaped residence with intersecting crossing gables, composition shingle siding, and concrete over cinder block foundation. Roof is wood shingle & has interior brick chimney. Windows on main part of residence are wood frame, double hung with wood-surround trim. Front-facing gable roof covers projecting enclosed porch with fixed wood-frame, multi light windows, and coursed, fock-faced brick of varying lengths. Front porch extension has concrete front steps with iron railing. Rear of structure has shed roof addition. A one-story, gable-roof two car garage located to the side of the residence has two large sliding doors with vertical siding and outside mounted rail & rollers. Garage has horizontal wood siding and wood-shingle roof.

This is a neutral structure.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE: Justify how the persons, important events, and/or historical patterns associated with the structure/site and surrounding area lend the property significance.

John Roe was a miner at the Roundup Coal Mine No. 3 in 1912, a trackman for the No. 3 mine in 1914, a teamster for Meagher Brothers (1916).

Structure is located in block with other small older residences along main highway into town. Addition of large front porch and rear shed roof extension has caused some loss of integrity of design. Use of composition shakes on structure and rock faced apron on enclosed front porch have caused loss of integrity of materials.
