This small rectangular wood-frame one-story residence has a gable roof and a shed roof rear addition. Other features include wood roof shingles, enclosed eaves, beveled edge wood siding with corner boards, wood under eaves trim board, narrow 1/1 double-hung windows in wood surround, wood foundation, a wood panel in wood surround back door, a front wood and glass panel door. There are modern cement steps in back and a slab step in front, and 1/1 fixed window in wood

There was no back addition on the building originally, and a side porch was probably enclosed at sometime.

To the back is an old shed roof outhouse with board siding, wood paneled door and no foundation.

This is a contributing structure.
