This rectangular one story wood frame residence has a gable roof, and over the front and rear doors is a gabled hood with wood shingles, collar beam and diagonal braces. Other features include 2/2 double hung windows, wide water table board, enclosed eaves with trim board, and a wooden front

Modern materials include asphalt roofing, cement block chimney, vertical wood paneling with corner boards, wide horizontal gable paneling, cement foundation (added 1964), and 1/1 slide wood windows in the rear. There is a wrought iron rail to the front stoop.

Outbuildings include (1) shed roof, wood frame out house with asphalt roofing, corrogated metal siding (2) gable roof outhouse with wood roof shingles, beveled edge siding with corner boards, lowered wood window (3) wood frame rectangular garage with asphalt roofing and siding and casement hung vertical board garage doors. No foundation.

This is a contributing structure.
