

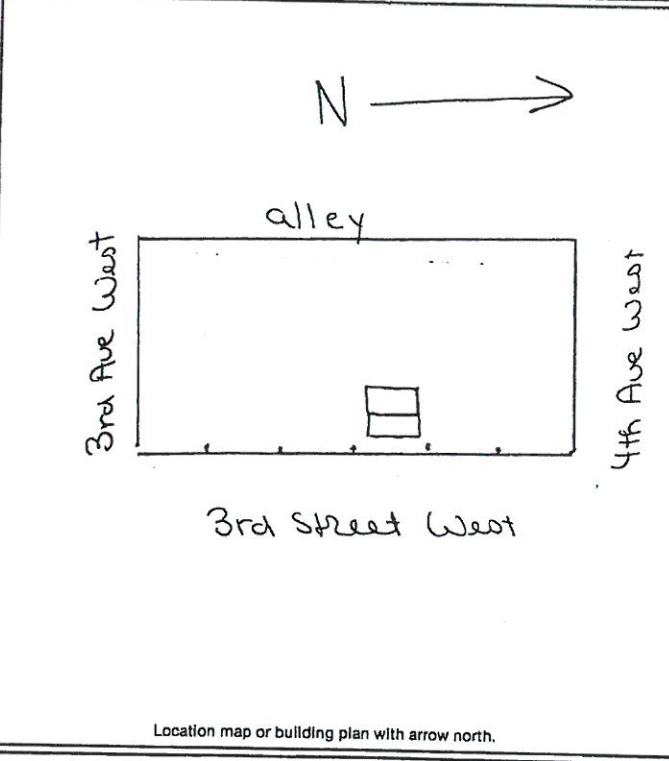

A one and a half, square-shaped wood frame residence with gable roof, front porch under flared eave, one bay, and a concrete foundation. Residence has two chimneys, one interior and one exterior, both with corbeled T-shapes. Roof has composition shingles, eaves with fascia, purlins and diagonal support braces. Siding is clapboard with end boards. Windows are wood frame, double-hung 1/1 with wood-surround trim, drip board sills. Front porch is enclosed with wood frame door with panel and multi lights. Front bay is semi octagonal, with large fixed windows.

This is a contributing structure.
