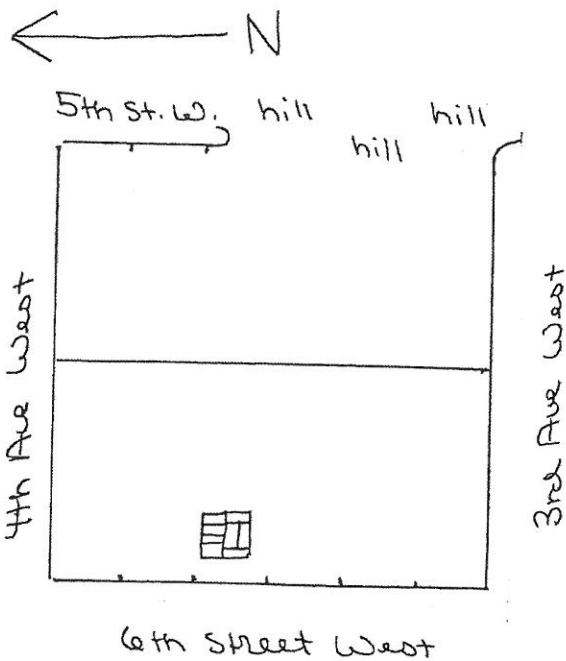

This one story rectangular wood frame residence originally had an interesting gable roof with a shed roof enclosed front porch and a shed roof addition to the rear other features include a central brick stretcher bond brick chimney (that was repaired at a later time). Two long rectangular fixed wood frame porch windows and a 6 light wood panel front door and boxed enclosed eaves. Modern features include side and back shed additions, asphalt roofing, wide aluminum siding, aluminum frame 1/1 and 4 light rectangular fixed and wind windows on the south and a cement foundation.

This is a neutral structure.
