
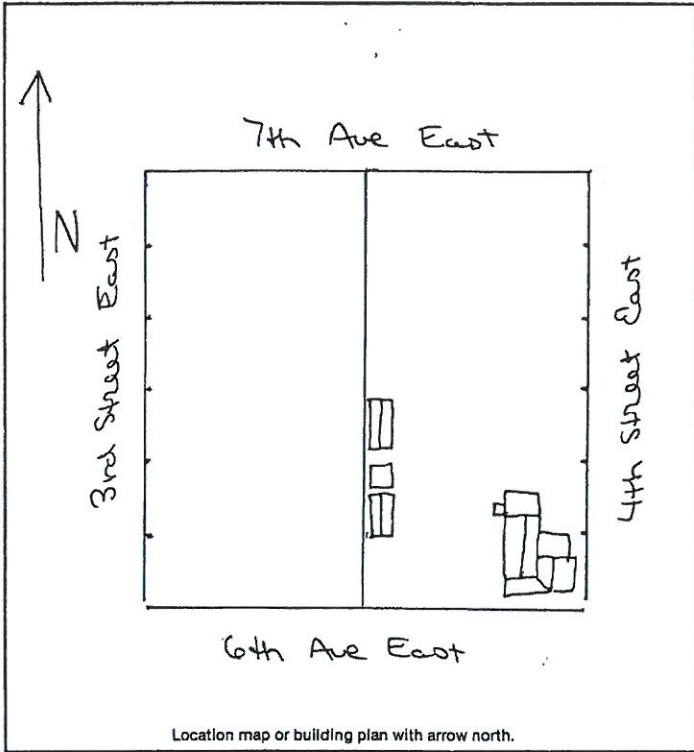

This part 1 story, part 2 story wood frame rectangular residence has an original two story clipped gable roof with pent roof partial gable returns. One story additions are all hip roof with a shed roof car port to the east. Other features include some wood shingles 2/2 double hung gable window, enclosed eaves with molded trim, and various 1/1 double hung windows. Modern materials include asphalt roofing, wide press-board siding, various wood and aluminium frame rectangular fixed tilt, and slide windows, an exterior cement block and stove pipe chimney, and a modern 3 light front door with screen door, Outbuildings include; 1. a wood frame gable roof wood roof and sides shingled garage with 6/6 slide wood windows, exposed rafters, vertical board casement hung garage doors, and no foundation. 2. a shed roof shed, with board siding and wood shingle roof, no foundation. 3. a gable roof garage with beveled edge siding and corner boards, exposed rafters, wood roof shingles, 6 light fixed windows, vertical board casement hung garage doors and no foundation.

This is a neutral structure.
